### A PILGRIMAGE JUST BEGINNING Star COMMISSION Strategic Alliances for RELEM

The StAR Commission has recently completed a significant journey across the seven Districts, one Delegation, and one Sector of RELEM. This initiative brought together Brothers and Lasallians entrusted with the responsibility of the Lasallian Educational Mission in our Region.

The meetings followed a structured process that included:

- 1. Listening sessions highlighting the strengths, needs and opportunities for collaboration.
- 2. A short Presentation by the Commission outlining the main areas.

A World Café activity to refine key sections of the Consultation Document: Section H - The suggested Timeline and Section J- Key Events; Section I - the Guiding Principles; and Appendix 2 - Possible Initiatives of Collaboration that could be implemented straight away from March 2025.

These encounters were not merely opportunities to discuss governance but, more profoundly, moments to discern together the decisions necessary for the vitality and sustainability of the Lasallian Mission in RELEM.

This synodal process emphasised listening, mutual respect, and a shared focus on the Mission, rising above diverse perspectives. Together, participants explored new horizons—unexpected and unprecedented—guided by a collective vision for a stronger, more unified Mission.

Each District contributed by sharing its strengths and vulnerabilities, reflecting on critical areas such as:

- Formation opportunities and needs.
- Developing the role of lay Lasallians in Mission leadership and governance.
- Conditions the allow Association to grow and flourish
- Community Life and New Communities
- Innovations in pastoral and vocational efforts to serve those most in need.
- Strategies for stewarding patrimonial resources to best serve the Mission.



The journey concluded during the Advent season, a time of hope and renewal. It was a fitting period to remain open to God's "eternal newness" while committing to the belief that something transformative is being born.

By late January or early February 2025, a second consolidated text will be shared with the

Districts and Delegation. This document will harmonise insights from the recent visits and propose a roadmap leading up to 2026. It will be open for review and further enrichment before discussion at the March 2025 Visitors' Conference, where Visitors and the RELEM MEL Council will determine the next steps.

This work takes place against the backdrop of the Jubilee Year, marking the 1700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea. As Pope Francis reminds us: "Nicaea represents a summons to all Churches and Ecclesial Communities to persevere on the path to visible unity..." That they may all be one... so that the world may believe" (John 17:21)" (*n* 17, Spes non confundit, Pope



*Francis*). It invites us to find hope both in God's grace and in the "signs of the times" that guide us forward.

# CULTURE OF VCCATACSON

From 5th –7th of December, the Culture of Vocations Commission met in Rome with representatives from across the Region. The meeting focused on vital aspects of Vocation Ministry, including strategies to support and cultivate a Culture of Vocations within the Lasallian Family.

Time was spent discussing a key focus of the Commission which is leveraging the potential of "Vocation Hotspots." The identification and support of Vocation Hotspots- areas, programmes, and initiatives that hold potential opportunity to support and promote the Brothers' Vocation, was called for by the 2024 Regional Mission Assembly.

Discussions also addressed upcoming Regional activities for the Jubilee Year—Pilgrims of Hope and strategic planning to advance the calls from the 2024 Regional Mission Assembly, the Third International Mission Assembly, the International Young Brother Assembly, and the 46th General Chapter.

Commission members shared insights into realities within their respective Districts, highlighting current initiatives and identifying emerging needs. Time was spent with Mr. Mourad Barsoum, who provided insights into the projects of the Institute Office of Vocation and Volunteers.

While we recognise the challenges in Lasallian Vocation of Brothers and Partr commission remains committed to our call to help all in the Lasallian Family discover their purpose and to live into God's Dream in their lives. Plans to support Districts with resources, Formation and collaboration across the Region are planned as we continue this important work.

### **1ST 'LASALIAN RESEARCH SEMINAR' INFORMATION OF THE ANALYSIC OF THE ANALYSIC**

From 28th October to 1st November 9 Lasallians from our Region took part, together with 50 other Brothers and lay Lasallians from the five Regions of the Institute in the 1st "Seminar on Lasallian Research" (S.I.L.) organised by the Office of Lasallian Patrimony and Research at the Generalate in Rome.

The Seminar - the theme of which was "Lasallian Association for the mission, its development for the future" - was organised "as a space for exchange, a space which seeks a return trip between life and academic considerations", in the words of Brother Santiago Rodríguez Mancini, Director of the Office of Lasallian Patrimony and Research, with a participative methodology based on the prior reading of a working document entitled "From the vows to the Community".

Pedro Gil, author of this document, helped to focus the week's reflection on the last 50 years in the world and societies, the Church and the Institute, highlighting the opportunities for Association and the pedagogy of fraternity, which also took into account the story of the Bull of approval of the Institute and its subsequent journey, in the context of the tercentenary of this important step in which Association found an institutionalised form.

They also reflected on synodality as an ecclesiological note of Lasallian Association and its possibilities as a "story of the future", while sharing various accounts of the institutionalisation of Association for the Mission of the Districts, Regions and other bodies to which the participants in the Seminar belong, among whom were also some members of the Councils, Offices and Commissions of the Institute. The Seminar also included opportunities for presentations, personal and group reflection, as well as moments for sharing the experience of faith and fraternity.

In the final session of the Seminar, the fruit of the group work was presented, the challenges that the participants will present in their Districts and a proposal to establish a system for the reflection of Association and the challenges for the bodies institutions and in the structures of association for the mission at the different levels of Lasallian life.
